

## Dear Senator.

On behalf of United Way's partners in Lucas, Ottawa and Wood counties: **We want to urge the U.S. Senate** to pass the Child Care is Essential Act (S. 3874), which would allocate \$50 billion dollars to the Child Care Development Block Grant, helping childcare providers across Ohio and the U.S. uphold financially strenuous operational protocols during this difficult time.

The Child Care is Essential Act was passed by the U.S. House (H.R. 7027) and then delivered to the U.S. Senate for voting consideration, where it has sat untouched since July 30, 2020. It is **imperative that our elected leaders continue to seek action-steps**, and advocate to their fellow members of Congress, to bolster childcare in your state.

Robust, high-quality early learning centers are key to a child's long-term cognitive development and academic success. Secondly, the existence of childcare resources allows working parents to return to full-time employment, keeping businesses operating via a strong, local workforce.
